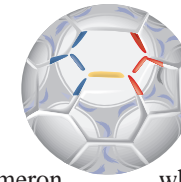

Tigers - Girls U-9

It is with great pride that the Winslow Tigers U9 Girls Travel Soccer Team is informing the WTYSA and the Winslow Township Community that this first year team has a current undefeated record of five (5) consecutive wins in the U9 National Division of the SJGSL. The National Division is the second most competitive division at this age level in the SJGSL out of 13 divisions. The Winslow Tigers are currently in first place in the U9 National Division of the SJGSL. The teams which were defeated to secure this first place position were the Cherry Hill Avalanche (4-2), Medford Gladiators (3-1), Voorhees Rowdies (5-2), Deptford Stampede (5-2) and Hamilton Wildcats Maroon (5-3). In addition, the Winslow Tigers have finished in first place in three consecutive soccer tournaments

which include the TBAA Tournament, the Pittsgrove Tournament and the Pemberton Fort Dix Columbus Tournaments. During these tournaments, the Winslow Tigers faced teams from three different states (PA, DE & NJ) to secure a current tournament record of nine wins and one tie. A special acknowledgement is required at this time in recognition of the FANTASTIC collective soccer play of the following Winslow Tigers: Tziarra K., Amirah A., Kelly G., Lacey W., Nyla B., Daija J., Jenna S., Kayla G., Janae B., Sydney D., Gabriella D., Anonda O., Zoe M. and Jessica H. The team goal of the Winslow Tigers from the beginning of the season was to win the National Division and enter the Olympic Division next season. The hard work and commitment to succeed by the players on the Winslow Tigers has them currently on the right path to accomplish the team goal for this season. Winslow Fab 5 Girls

The Winslow FAB 5 soccer team of Tziarra K., Amirah A., Kelly G., Lacey W. and Imani Y. entered into the 2006 National Kick-It 3v3 soccer tournament sponsored by Sports Illustrated (SI) in the beginning of 2006. The Winslow FAB 5 successfully completed the qualifying tournament round in West Chester, PA, on June 17th by defeating all of the teams in their age group from several different states. This success qualified the Winslow FAB 5 for the SI Kick-It 3v3 North East Regional Soccer Championships in East Brunswick, NJ, on August 19th. At this championship tournament, teams were entered from every northeast state from Maine to Maryland. In addition, the Winslow FAB 5 won six consecutive 3v3 games to come out on top as the SI Kick-It 3v3 North East Regional Soccer Champions for 2006. As a result of this victory, the Winslow FAB 5 have qualified for the SI Kick-It Soccer World Championships in Orlando, Florida, at the Disney Wide World of Sports Complex beginning on Saturday, January 13th 2007. The Winslow FAB 5 will now have an opportunity to compete against both national and international 3v3 soccer teams. Four of the players on the Winslow FAB 5 (Tziarra, Amirah, Kelly and Lacey) are also players on the Winslow Tigers U9 Girls Travel Soccer Team which is currently undefeated with 5 consecutive league wins in the National Division of the SJGSL.
